2021 Calgary Municipal Election

WHEN: October 18, 2021 Election Day is Monday, October 18, 2021! But, you can take advantage of advance voting across the city from October 4-10th. WHAT ARE WE VOTING FOR?

Who will be the next mayor? Your next councillor? You Decide. https://calgarylibrary.ca/connect/calgary-election-2021/ All eligible voters will receive a ballot to cast their vote for mayor, councillor, school board members and senate nominees.

Mental Health First Aid is Back in a Standard (Virtual) Format!!!

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is the support provided to a person who may be experiencing a decline in their mental well-being or a mental health crisis. Course participants will learn how to:

- Recognize signs that a person may be experiencing a decline in their mental well-being or a mental health crisis
- Have conversations that encourage a person to:
- Talk about declines in their mental well-being
- Discuss professional and other supports that could help with recovery to improved mental well-being
- Reach out to these supports
- Assist in a mental health or substance use crisis
- Use MHFA actions to maintain one's own mental well-being

Module 1: Self Directed (2 hours) Module 2 & 3: Virtual Classroom (7 hours)

<u>CPI Training -</u> expires every three years October 5 - evening 6 - 9 pm October 7 or 21 November 4 or 18 December 2 or 16

To register follow these steps:

Staff are to follow this link https://calendly.com/sarah-mcmillen-cpi/cpi-training to book online. **Choose one date only.**

Staff will receive an email confirmation with instructions. Staff will receive an email/link from CPI for the online portion - this **MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE** the day of the training. You will receive a zoom invite from the instructor the Monday before the date you chose.

If there are any concerns with the online portion once logged in, staff should contact HELP at CPI.

Staff will be required to fill in the Payroll Deduction form found on the website in Forms and Documents and email it to reception@c-a-s-s.org

Please note, the payroll deduction is \$45 - be sure you use the correct form. The deduction will come off your pay during the month of your course date - the date you complete the online portion with CPI.

Due to the nature of the "physicals" portion of this training and the continued COVID restrictions, this portion of the training has been postponed indefinitely. Staff will receive their blue card with an asterisk, reminding staff they will be responsible for completing the "physicals" once restrictions are lifted and dates and times are scheduled.
